FIRE PROTECTION AND PREVENTION

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Sec. 27-1. Title.

This chapter shall be entitled fire protection and prevention.

Sec. 27-2. Administration.

The fire marshal shall be responsible for the fire inspections and the application and issuance of fire protection permits for other than single-family and two-family dwellings.

Sec. 27-3. Annual fire inspection required; exemptions.

All buildings and structures within the city, except single-family and two-family dwellings, shall have and be subject to an annual fire prevention inspection by the city to insure compliance with all applicable provisions of the Standard Fire Prevention Code and the Life Safety Code as adopted by the city. The owner or occupant of any building or structure subject to such an inspection shall have 45 days to correct violations identified as the result of such an inspection unless a longer period of time for such corrective action is granted by the city upon a showing of good cause.

Sec. 27-4. Fire protection permit fees and fire prevention inspection fees.

The fees for permits required by the Standard Fire Prevention Code and fire prevention inspections performed by the city shall be those from time to time established by duly adopted resolution of the city council. In such resolution, the city council shall also have the authority to establish fees for administrative services including, but not limited to, site plan review, water flow tests and re-inspection.
