

## Hurricane Matthew Clean-Up Status

DATE: Monday, October 11, 2015

- Normal **Household Garbage, Recycling** and Containerized Yard Waste Collection resumes Monday 10/11/16 by Waste Management
- Excess bagged household waste placed by the garbage cart will be picked up during the recovery period.
- Yard Waste piles pickups beginning Tuesday 10/12/16 by Disaster Recovery Contractors, they will also pick up **Construction Debris** start date to be determined
  - AshBritt - North of Pineda Causeway
  - Crowder-Gulf - South of Pineda Causeway
- Only waste placed in at the curb ( in right of way) will be collected
- **Yard Waste** and **Construction debris** must be separated at the curb
- **Yard Waste** should be placed in containers or cut in 4' lengths if possible; discourage bagged yard waste!!!!
- **Construction Debris** includes roofing material, fencing, docks, carpeting, etc.
- There will be two sweeps through the County at least two weeks apart for yard waste piles and construction debris. County will notify public when first sweep is complete.
- White goods ( refrigerators, freezers, washing machines) will be picked up by Waste Management, however, residents need to call WM for special pick up of these.
- **CDF Landfill, Sarno Road Landfill, Sarno Transfer Station, Mockingbird Way Mulching Facility, and Titusville Transfer Station** will be open to the public during normal business hours 7:30 - 5:30pm Monday thru Saturday, as well as Sunday October 16th. (Additional Sunday openings may be added if necessary once debris collection begins)
- *(Debris contractors and Waste Management will have longer access hours to the landfill 7:00a.m. to 7:00 pm)*
- **TetraTech** is the County's recovery consultant and will be organizing the contractors' sweeps throughout the County. They will provide updates directly to us as to where the collection activity is scheduled and where it has been completed. Hopefully they will provide daily maps.
- Public should check our Facebook page for more information, and we will be advertising in newspaper and doing PSAs for radio.
